INSTITUTIONALISM 🗸



We expect the UK to remain path dependent, while for the U.S., we expect a critical juncture: the 9/11 attacks.

POLITICAL 🗸



We expect that the 9/11 attacks in the U.S., and the influx of refugees in 2015 in the UK created a policy window.





We expect that evidence-based policy-making has little influence on the guardianship policies in the UK and the U.S.



We expect that the target population in both contexts is similarly framed as vulnerable and passive.



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
